### *Celebrate your local heritage* *Visit these eight historic buildings*

#### 1. Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church

**Open 10am to 4pm**

Pretty church, consecrated in 1913 and funded by local resident and railway engineer, George Pauling.

#### 2. St Lawrence Church\*

**Open 9am to 5pm**

Grade II listed church dating from 12th century with history displays and grave of Sir Barnes Wallis in graveyard.

#### 3. Methodist Chapel\*

**Open 10am to 5pm**

Built in 1854 by Non-Conformists. Features history displays and children's activities including a quiz, fossil dig and real meteorites.

#### 4. St Teresa's School\*

**Open 9am to 5pm**

**Tours hourly from 10.15am to 4.15pm**

Former Effingham East Court Manor House built in 1799 and set in picturesque estate with stunning views over the surrounding countryside. History displays.

#### 5. All Saints Church

**Open 9am to 5pm**

Pretty Grade II listed church in lovely setting with unusual collection of funeral hatchments.

#### 6. Manor House School

**Open 10am to 5pm**

Grade II listed former Little Bookham Manor House built in 18th century and set in beautiful gardens.


#### 7. Manor Farm Tithe Barn\*

**Open 9am to 5pm**

One of the largest Tithe Barns in Surrey dating from 15th century. Grade II listed. The courtyard is the perfect setting for tea.

#### Little Bookham in World War 1 Exhibition

#### 8. The Grange\*

**Open 11am to 3pm**

Victorian house with magnificent ballroom, walled garden and beautiful grounds. Now a centre for people with disabilities. Teas served in the Conservatory.

#### Opening of Heritage Room at The Grange

New Heritage Room funded by the Heritage Lottery Fund displaying work from its former role as The School of Stitchery and Lace.
