An opportunity to visit these historic buildings

1. Effingham Golf Club

Open 9am to 11am only

Club House is Grade II listed and dates from 18th century with earlier features. It was Effingham Manor House from 1832. Note: No parking available.

3. Methodist Chapel*

Open Friday & Saturday 10am to 5pm

Sunday 12 noon to 4pm

Wesleyan Chapel built in 1854. Village history and People Power Displays. Children's activities about fossils, meteorites and dinosaurs.

5. St Teresa's School*

Open 9am to 5pm

Tours hourly from 10.15am to 4.15pm

Former Effingham East Court Manor House built in 1799 and set in picturesque estate with stunning views over the surrounding countryside. History displays.

7. Manor House School

Open 10am to 5pm

Grade II listed former Little Bookham Manor House built in 18th century and set in beautiful gardens.

2. St Lawrence Church*

Open 9am to 2pm

Grade II* listed church dating from 12th century with history displays and grave of Sir Barnes Wallis in the churchyard.

4. Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church

Open 10am to 4pm

Pretty church, consecrated in 1913 and funded by local resident and railway engineer, George Pauling.

6. All Saints Church

Open 9am to 5pm

Pretty Grade II* listed church originating from around 1100 in lovely setting with one of the finest sets of funeral hatchments in Surrey.

8. The Grange *

Open 9am to 4pm

Tea and cakes in conservatory 11am to 3pm

19th century house and gardens. Maps since 1614. Heritage Room with items made for Queen Mary when The Grange was 'The School of Stitchery and Lace'.

9. Manor Farm Tithe Barn*
