



Effingham and Little Bookham

An opportunity to visit these historic buildings

1. St Lawrence Church

Open 10am to 4pm

Grade II* listed church dating from the 12th century with history displays and grave of Sir Barnes Wallis, inventor of the 'bouncing bomb', in the churchyard.

3. Effingham Golf Club

Open 9am to midday

Magnificent Georgian building and manor house from 1832 which is the club house for one of England's top 100 golf courses, designed and set out in 1927 by Harry Shapland Colt, perhaps England's most famous course architect, who designed 300 or more courses worldwide. Displays to explain the history of the house and the Golf Club. No on site parking available.

5. All Saints Church

Open 10am to 4pm

Pretty Grade II* listed church originating from around 1100 with one of the finest sets of funeral hatchments in Surrey. Family tree and information about the hatchments and memorials mainly of the Pollen/Maddox/Boileau family who were lords of the manor of Little Bookham from around 1640 to 1935. Beautiful setting with a 1,300 year old yew tree.

7. Manor Farm Tithe Barn*

Open 10am to 5pm

Impressive 15th Century Grade II listed Tithe Barn which is one of the largest in Surrey at 4,500 sq ft. Displays of the history of the Tithe Barn, farm and village. New for 2021, displays on traditional agriculture and the common fields systems of the Surrey North Downs dip slope villages including Effingham and Little Bookham. Event run by EFFRA and refreshments with home-made cakes in the Barn and courtyard garden organised by the Friends of Effingham and Little Bookham Churches.

2. Methodist Chapel*

Open 10am to 5pm

Pretty Victorian Wesleyan Chapel built in 1854. Displays of Effingham village history and "Edible England". Children's activities and quiz based on fossils, meteorites and dinosaurs. RSPB advice on birds in your garden.

4. St Teresa's School

Open 10am to 3pm Tours at quarter past the hour

A beautiful Georgian manor house, now part of a girls' school, situated near the summit of the Surrey Hills in a beautiful parkland setting with stunning views over the surrounding countryside. Displays of its history. Take a guided tour of the original buildings including the former manor house and the beautiful school chapel built in 1934.

6. Manor House School*

Open 10am to 5pm

An elegant 18th century manor house, extended in the 19th & 20th century, the home of Manor House School since 1937. It is set in beautifully landscaped grounds. Displays from the archives and self-guided tours of the house, buildings and grounds. The school is celebrating its centenary anniversary.


8. The Grange*

Open 11am to 3pm

Unique house dating from 1600s. Formerly home to The School of Stitchery and Lace (1938), now The Grange Centre for people with disabilities. Family friendly heritage trail, plus kids' activities. Beautiful walled gardens dating from 1850s. Interactive Heritage Room with lace and textile collection. 'Simply Scones' pop-up event serving tea, scones and cake with live dancing + music.
