1. Manor Farm Tithe Barn
Manor House Lane, Little Bookham KT23 4EW

Open 9.30 am to 5pm

Explore the history of Little Bookham – a tiny village between two ancient routeways which form its western and eastern boundaries, at the impressive 15th Century Grade II listed Tithe Barn, which is one of the largest in Surrey.

A special exhibition of illustrated displays will explain the village's history and audio visual presentations will cover specific aspects, including the village's founding in the Anglo Saxon period, its 17th century lord of the manor Sir Benjamin Maddox who owned half of Mayfair and its part in World War 1.

Enjoy tea, coffee and homemade cakes in the Tithe Barn and pretty courtyard garden.



2. Manor House School
Manor House Lane, Little Bookham KT23 4EN

Open 10am to 5pm

An elegant 18th century manor house, extended in the 19th & 20th centuries, and the home of the Manor House School since 1937. It is set in beautifully landscaped grounds. Displays from the archives and self guided tours of the house, buildings and grounds.



3. All Saints Church
Manor House Lane, Little Bookham KT23 4EL

Open 9.30am to 5pm

Pretty Grade II* listed church originating from around 1100 in a lovely setting with one of the finest sets of funeral hatchments in Surrey. Displays on church history and essential renovation works recently completed.

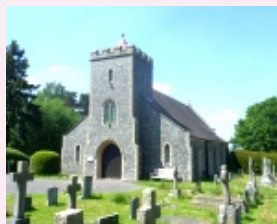

4. Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church
Lower Road, Effingham KT24 5AD

Open 10am to 4pm

Pretty church, consecrated in 1913 and funded by local resident and railway engineer, George Pauling.



5. Methodist Chapel
Chapel Hill, Effingham KT24 5NB

Open 10am to 4pm (Also Friday 10am to 4pm)

Wesleyan Chapel built in 1854. Church & village history displays. Children's activities featuring dinosaurs, fossils and meteorites. RSPB display.

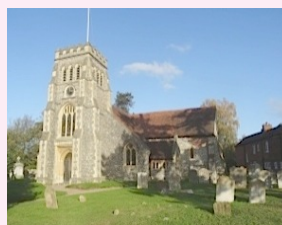
Tea, coffee and home-made cakes.



6. St Lawrence Church
Church Street, Effingham KT24 5LX

Open Saturday 10am to 4pm.
Also accessible other times.

Grade II* listed church dating from 12th century with history displays and the grave of Sir Barnes Wallis in the churchyard.



7. Effingham Golf Club
Guildford Road, Effingham KT24 5PZ

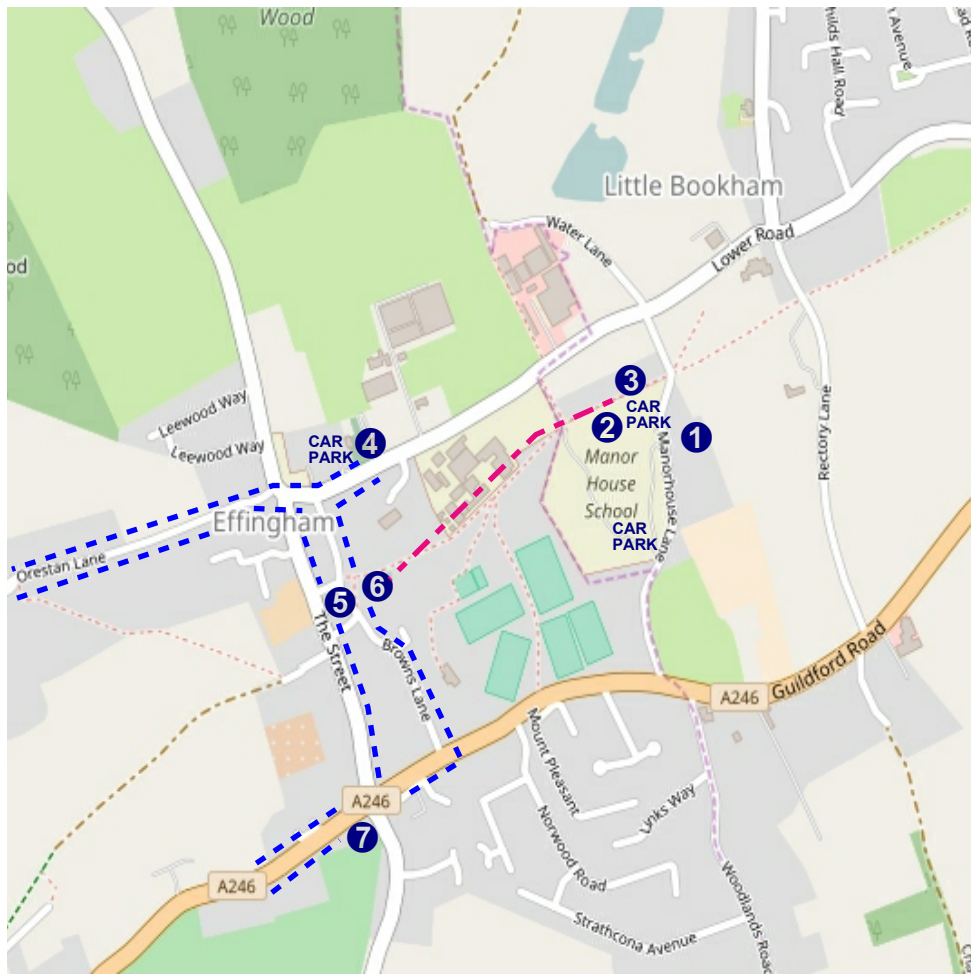
Open 9am to 12 noon only

One of the top 100 golf courses has Grade II listed Georgian clubhouse with later additions.

It was formerly Effingham Manor House from 1823. The famous golf club designer, Harry Shapland Colt, designed the course in 1927.
