1. Manor Farm Tithe Barn Manor House Lane, Little Bookham KT23 4EW

Open 9.30 am to 5pm

Explore the history of Little Bookham and find out about its historic buildings via illustrated displays and audio visual presentations at the impressive 15th



and audio visual presentations at the impressive 15th Century Grade II listed Tithe Barn which is one of the largest in Surrey.

Illustrated displays will explain the village's history and its historic buildings which include the manor house(s), church and Tithe Barn. Audio-visual presentations which will be repeated during the day will include:

- how little Bookham was originally founded between two Anglo Saxon routeways
- Little Bookham's historic buildings
- the life of Sir Benjamin Maddox who was lord of the manor of Little Bookham in the 17th century and owned half of Mayfair
- Little Bookham in World War I

2. Manor House School Manor House Lane, Little Bookham KT23 4EN

Open 9.30am to 5pm

An elegant 18th century manor house, extended in the 19th & 20th centuries, and the home of the Manor House School since 1937. It is set in beautifully landscaped grounds.



Displays from the archives and self guided tours of the house, buildings and grounds.

3. All Saints Church Manor House Lane, Little Bookham KT23 4EL

Open 9.30am to 5pm

Pretty Grade II* listed church originating from around 1100 in a lovely setting with one of the

finest sets of funeral hatchments in Surrey. Displays on church history and essential renovation works recently completed.



4. Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church Lower Road, Effingham KT24 5AD

Open 10am to 4pm

Pretty church, consecrated in 1913 and funded by local resident and railway engineer, George Pauling.



5. Methodist Chapel Chapel Hill, Effingham KT24 5NB

Open 10am to 5pm (Also Friday 10am to 4pm)

Wesleyan Chapel built in 1854. Church & village history displays.

Children's activities featuring dinosaurs, fossils and meteorites. RSPB display.

6. St Lawrence Church Church Street, Effingham KT24 5LX

Open 10am to 4pm

Grade II* listed church dating from 12th century with history displays and the grave of Sir Barnes Wallis in the churchyard.




Open 9am to 12 noon only
