1. Manor Farm Tithe Barn **Manor House Lane, Little Bookham KT23 4EW**

Open 9.30 am to 5pm

Visit this impressive 15th Century Grade II listed Tithe Barn at Manor Farm in Little Bookham, which is one of the largest in Surrey at 4,500 square feet.

This year we celebrate the establishment of the Bookhams Residents' Association in 1926 with displays covering the subsequent 100 years of the Bookhams' history.



Other illustrated displays tell the history of this tiny village of Little Bookham including its historic buildings which include the manor house(s), church and Tithe Barn.

Enjoy the audio-visual presentations covering 100 year's of the Bookhams' history and episodes in the history of Little Bookham, which will be repeated during the day.

Enjoy tea, coffee and homemade cakes in the Tithe Barn and pretty courtyard garden.

Families with children are very welcome. Parking is available on site with further parking at the neighbouring Manor House School (not open to visit).

2. All Saints Church **Manor House Lane, Little Bookham KT23 4EL**

Open 9.30am to 5pm

Pretty Grade II* listed church originating from around 1100 in a lovely setting with one of the finest sets of funeral hatchments in Surrey.

Illustrated displays on the fascinating history of this pretty little church and essential renovation works recently completed.

Parking at the church or as for Manor Farm Tithe Barn nearby.



3. Our Lady of Sorrows Catholic Church Lower Road, Effingham KT24 5AD

Open 10am to 4pm

Pretty church, consecrated in 1913 and funded by local resident and railway engineer, George Pauling.



4. Methodist Chapel Chapel Hill, Effingham KT24 5NB

Open 10am to 5pm (Also Friday 10am to 4pm)

Wesleyan Chapel built in 1854. Church & village history displays.

Children's activities featuring dinosaurs, fossils and meteorites. RSPB display.

5. St Lawrence Church Church Street, Effingham KT24 5LX

Open 10am to 4pm

Grade II* listed church dating from 12th century with history displays and the grave of Sir Barnes Wallis in the churchyard.



6. Effingham Golf Club Guildford Road, Effingham KT24 5PZ

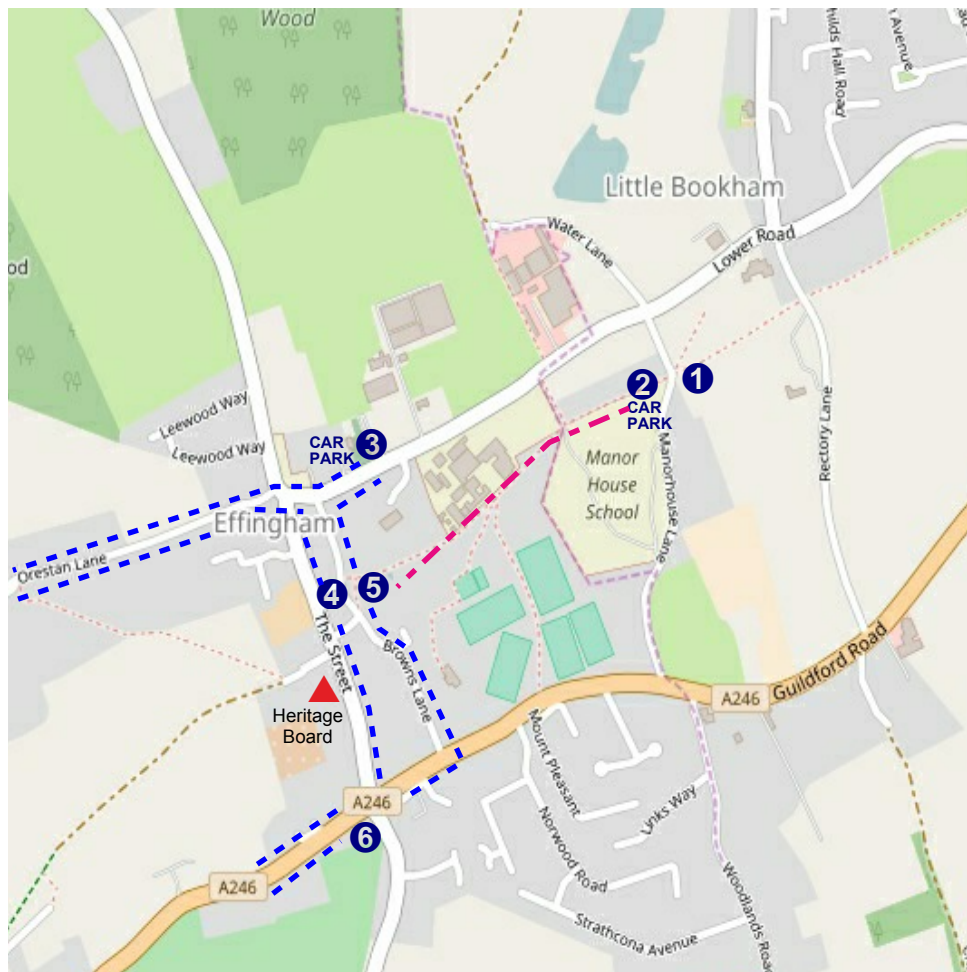
Open 9am to 12 noon only

One of the top 100 golf courses has Grade II listed Georgian clubhouse with later additions.



It was formerly Effingham Manor House from 1823. The famous golf club designer, Harry Shapland Colt, designed the course in 1927.
